# **General rules**

- Motion ...... This house......
- 2 teams government/ (proposition & opposition)
- 3 speakers in each team
- 8 (6) minutes for the 1st, the 2nd and the 3rd speaker
- 4 (3) minutes for the reply speaker made by the 1st or the 2nd speaker







## **General rules**

- You can ask a question (Points Of Information) during an opponent's speech between the 1st and the 5th minute.
- The question should be not longer than 15 sec.
- The speaker has a choice to accept (at least 1) or reject the question.

# **Prepared**

 is prepared before using any possible resources

# **Impromptu**

- is announced about 1h before
- are not allowed to use any help or resources








#### **Duties of the 1st speaker**






- Defines the topic/menu.
- Presents the policy of the government, arguments and describe them.
- Presents the opposing view of the topic.
- Refutes the governments arguments.
- Presents their arguments and examples.







#### **Duties of the 2nd speaker**




- Defends his first speaker's case from attacks by oppone nts.
- Gives a rebuttal to opponents's arguments.
- Presents new arguments.
- Expands and continues to develop the team's case.







#### **Duties of the 3rd speaker**



- Provides no new arguments and information.
- Finds the most important points of the debate (the idea, the points of focus (Clash Points)).
- Tries to refute the opponents's arguments.








#### **Duties of the 4th speaker**



- A comprehensive overview of the debate the team's case and the replies to the other side/offer an objective summary of the debate.
- Give the reasons why their team has won without mentioning any new examples, rebuttals or arguments.






# **Process of judgment**

#### **CONTENT**

Speakers speech is logical, structured.



#### **STYLE**

Posture, intonation, choice of vocabulary, gestures, pace of speech.

#### **STRATEGY**

Effective usage of time management. How arguments were chosen to present, has the speaker asked and answered (at least 1) the POI.


